RE: 2011 NYS Fair 4-H Horse Information

IMPORTANT INFORMATION!! PLEASE READ!

1. **All youth showing in 4-H Horse Events should be given or have access to:**

- **A New York State Fair “4-H Horse Events Guide”** – posted to the Animal Science Website at: http://www.ansci.cornell.edu/4H/nysfair_info.html
- **A State Fair “Youth – Animal Exhibits” premium book** – are now posted to the NYS Fair website: <http://www.nysfair.org/competitions/>

2. **Remind all youth showing horses that they MUST BRING the following items:**

- **Original Coggins (EIA) certificate** - must be dated 2010 or 2011 - present at the 4-H Horse Show office at check in – and a copy must be attached to the entry form being sent to Robin Bartholomew/4-H Horse Superintendent.
- **Original proof of rabies vaccination** - vaccination is good for one year from date of inoculation. The animal’s rabies vaccination status must remain current throughout its stay on the fairgrounds. Inoculation must be given at least 14 days prior to event date. If the animal was inoculated last year, the 14-day time span is only necessary if there was a lapse of time from the previous year's inoculation. Original – present at the 4-H Horse Show office at check in – and a copy must be attached to the entry form being sent to Robin Bartholomew/4-H Horse Superintendent.
- **ASTM-1163; SEI or ASTM-F-1163-04a/SEI** - approved helmet – present at the 4-H Horse Show office.

NOTE: New for 2011!! There will be no Vet Inspection Station when entering grounds.

3. **Submit electronically or mail original NYS Fair 4-H Horse Show entries directly to State Fair and one copy of entries directly to 4-H Horse Show Superintendent, as indicated on the entry forms.**
4. **Signatures** – **NOTE**: the NY State Fair Horse Show entries will need a county educator/designated staff signature AND the HEC “Regional Chair” signature.

ENTRY DEADLINE: MONDAY - AUGUST 15, 2011

NOTE: If ALL required signatures are not on a NYS Fair Horse Show entry – they will not be accepted as an “official entry”. There is a very short turn around time, from entry deadline to the first show day, in which data can be entered in the computer – there is no time for phone calls!! Do not jeopardize an opportunity for the youth!!

5. If a county does not use the 4-H Horse Show quota of 4 entries per county per Division – the unused slots may be given to another county in their HEC Region – this will be monitored by the Region not at the state-level – Remember the Region has only their set number of stalls and must manage and monitor their use. If you exceed your quota – please contact the stable manager as indicated in the region’s “stabling packet”.
6. **Entry Forms** - for Hippology, Horse Judging, Drill/Parade Teams/Quadrille and Mounted Games Teams are posted to the web site at:

7. The Western Reining Pattern will be **pattern # 6**.
8. **Readers are optional** in Dressage.
9. **Hippology**:
 - There will be a live horse judging portion of the event again this year.
 - Since the live judging will be held outside, youth should bring raincoats, just in case.
 - Bring at least 2 pens or pencils and a clipboard.
10. **Horse Judging**:

 - **Please give** a copy of this memo to each Horse Judging Coach.
 - **Remember** – Team only must be designated by the entry deadline/the team members may be declared the day of the contest.

PLEASE READ and PLEASE HAVE THE YOUTH READ!!

12. **Kids and Horses Tent:**

* Please help make this tent a success again this year!!! **We need old ribbons and horseshoes.** Challenge each youth riding in the horse show to bring 10 old horseshoes. Please drop ribbons and horseshoes off at the "Kids and Horses Tent". Thank You!!

14. **REMEMBER** - Straw will **not** be provided. Please bring your own stall bedding or purchase as directed in the youth premium book. Limited shavings will be available on the show grounds.

2011 NYS FAIR 4-H HORSE SHOW

BE AWARE - THAT THERE ARE MANY DISTRACTIONS FOR HORSES AT THE NYS FAIR 4-H HORSE SHOW. THERE ARE HELICOPTERS, COWS, FAIR RIDES, SIRENS, TRAFFIC AND LOTS OF OTHER CONFUSION AND CHAOS!! **BE PREPARED AS THIS IS NORMAL AT THE NYS FAIR!!**

PLEASE NOTE: State Fair Policy – **Original** rabies certificate and Coggins papers must accompany the animal – bring to the 4-H Horse Show office at check in. No animal will be admitted that does not meet all health requirements. **Refer to** Health Requirements section of your State Fair “Youth – Animal Exhibits” premium book. A **copy** of both the rabies certificate and the Coggins papers **must be** attached to the entry form being sent to Robin Bartholomew/4-H Horse Superintendent.

REMEMBER – Exhibitor numbers **must be worn** at all times when mounted or seated in a cart, while on the NYS Fairgrounds.

REMIND - YOUTH THAT THEY **WILL NOT** RECEIVE STATE FAIR PREMIUMS IF THE PROCEDURE FOR CLEANING STALLS IS NOT ADHERED TO – REFER THEM TO THE “2011 NEW YORK STATE 4-H HORSE EVENTS GUIDE”.

State Fair Photos

Please remember that 4-H youth that compete in events at State Fair may have their pictures taken. And that youth pictures from any of the various events may be used in media and/or press releases, used for educational displays, or could get posted to a web site.

IF your county is sending a 4-H youth to any state level 4-H Horse event – **PLEASE** make sure that the county has a photo release form on file in the county office. If you do not have a photo release form on file for any child that will be participating in State Fair events – **PLEASE MAKE SURE WE ARE AWARE OF THIS PRIOR TO THE EVENT.**

REMEMBER - NO Straw bedding will be supplied. See youth premium book to pre-order or bring your own bedding. Limited shavings will be available on the show grounds.

RE: **Miscellaneous Items and Dress Code for the State 4-H Horse Judging Event**

HORSES NEEDED!! We will need horses for the judging contest. We are looking for Western, Hunt Seat, Saddle Seat, Driving horses and possibly others. **If youth are willing to have their horse be part of the 4-H Judging Event, please fill out the enclosed form and send to April Winslow, address and more instructions are on the form. The Deadline is August 15, 2011!!** 4-Her's will get paid a day premium and a handler fee if they participate. **We really need your help this year to make this a wonderful event for the 4-H youth. Thank you!**

The following are **suggestions** for appropriate clothing to be worn at the State Judging Contest:

- * Long pants
- * Leather footwear
- * Rain gear

Try to dress like a horse show judge would dress, if they were judging a horse show.

The following clothing is **not** allowed:

- * Shorts or short skirts
- * Sandals or women's dress shoes
- * Tank tops
- * T-shirts or sweatshirts with club or breed designation
- * Hats (Equestrian or other)

PLEASE NOTE – No item of clothing may be worn which will establish the individual identity of the contestant or which will imply a direct or indirect association with a stable, a breed, a club, or a county. Hats are prohibited in the judging arena.

* Clipboard or notebook (with blank paper only!) **NO** WRITTEN MATERIALS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE RING!!

* At least 2 pens or pencils

Drinks: Are not supplied – please remind youth to bring with them if they want them.

Lunches: Please bring with you for all seniors. They will not get a formal lunch break. Juniors will be released and can go to get lunch on their own.

ALSO: please be prepared to designate **one volunteer** for every county to help with the contest. We will need runners, scorers, ring leaders and more. Thank you!
